Introduction

The Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) of St. Xavier's College, Ranchi successfully organized a Voter Registration Campaign from 23rd-25th October, 2024 to promote awareness about voting rights, electoral participation, and the importance of being responsible voters among the youth. The campaign had a huge focus on registration of new voters, updating details in the Voter ID and also upon deletion of the required details. The campaign was a part of the ongoing nationwide initiative to enhance voter literacy, particularly targeting first-time voters and encouraging electoral participation.



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Objectives of the Campaign

The primary goals of the Voter Awareness Campaign were:

- To educate students about their electoral rights and the voting process.
- To emphasize the importance of participating in elections for strengthening democracy.
- To motivate first-time voters to register and exercise their franchise.
- To clear misconceptions and address doubts regarding the voting process.

Planning and Preparation

The Electoral Literacy Club planned the campaign meticulously under the guidance of the President of ELC, Prof. B.K. Sinha and the Nodal Officer Prof. Ashutosh Pandey. A series of activities and events were designed to ensure maximum student participation and effective dissemination of information.

Publicity for the campaign was done through posters, social media, and announcements within the college premises.

Key Procedures

The programme focused on registration of new voters through the means of Form 6, updating any wrong details or addition of required details through Form 8. The event was multi-faceted in the sense that it provided for both Online as well as offline method to get the benefits. The volunteers of ELC were trained before this programme to ensure that they would be able to provide a hassle-free process of carrying out the required processes.



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Outcome of the Campaign

The campaign witnessed active participation from students, faculty, and staff.

Key outcomes included:

Day-1 Form 6 – 55 applicants

Day-2 Form 6 – 19 applicants (through offline forms) 16 applicants (online)

Form 8 – 8 applicants

Day -3 Form 6 – 35 applicants

Form 8 – 6 applicants

- Over 150 students took active part in the campaign.
- Around 125 first-time voters were successfully guided to register for their Voter ID cards.
- Increased awareness about the role of youth in strengthening democratic values.
- Enhanced understanding of the voting process and the importance of civic responsibility.
- 14 queries related to updating the details in the voter Id were addressed.

Feedback and Response

The campaign received overwhelming positive feedback. Students expressed their enthusiasm and gratitude for their registration into the electoral roll and gaining insights on various queries related to participation in the democratic process as a first-time voter. Many students acknowledged that they were unaware of the detailed registration process and felt empowered to contribute meaningfully to elections.



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The Voter Awareness Campaign organized by the Electoral Literacy Club was a resounding success. It not only educated the student community about the importance of voting but also instilled a sense of responsibility and active citizenship among participants. The campaign highlighted the role of youth in shaping the future of the nation through electoral participation.
