EARTH DAY (22-04-2025)

PAHALGAM ATTACK

(23-04-2025)

1/3 COY NCC St. Xavier's College, Ranchi in collaboration with NSS organised a candle march to pay tribute to the civilians who lost their lives in the Pahalgam attack on 22 April 2025. On this day, four to six terrorists belonging to the TRF opened fire on a group of tourists in the Baisaran Valley near Pahalgam. The attackers, dressed in military-style uniforms, emerged from the nearby forests and targeted the civilians of Jammu and Kashmir from close range. At least 28 people were killed, including 24 Indian nationals and four foreign nationals from Nepal and the UAE. Over 20 others were injured.

Today's candle march has been organized to pay tribute to the civilians and tourists and to reaffirm India's commitment to fight terrorism. The Pahalgam attack is a painful reminder of the cost to national security and the ongoing struggle against terrorism. It also strengthens India's resolve to ensure that such tragedies do not recur. A total of 250 people participated in the candle march, which included 150 NCC cadets and 100 NSS cadets. This participation showed the unity of all citizens, especially the youth, to fight against terrorism. At the end, ANO Lieutenant Dr. Priya Srivastava Madam addressed and gave us information about the program, which inspired all the cadets. The program was successful under her guidance.

The whole country is saddened by the cowardly attack on innocent tourists by terrorists in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir. We pay our heartfelt tribute to all the dead and wish for the speedy recovery of the injured. Also, all the countrymen demand from the government that strict and immediate action should be taken against the culprits.

Through this peace march, all of us NCC and NSS students want to give the message that we are all united and dedicated to keeping the integrity and unity of the country intact.
