Date: 28.02.2025

The Department of Geography and Geology, St. Xavier's College, Ranchi, in collaboration with IQAC, successfully organized a one-day seminar on "Rocks and Mineral Resources of Jharkhand". The event featured two distinguished experts from the Geological Survey of India- Shri Shyam Sundar Singh, Director, GSI; Shri Giridhari Das, Director, GSI. who provided valuable insights. Shri Shyam shared his expertise on Gondwana Rock System in Jharkhand while Shri Giridhari shared his wisdom on the Development of the Iron-ore Belt in Jharkhand and the adjoining Odisha region.

Objectives

- To provide the students with a thorough understanding on the evolution of the Indian shield during the Permo-Carboniferous and Precambrian Period.
- To provide in-depth knowledge of the geology of the Gondwana and Precambrian rocks and its economic potentiality.
- To understand the genesis, occurrences and importance of coal and iron ores in the states of Jharkhand and Odisha.

Outcome

The one-day seminar on "Rocks and Mineral Resources of Jharkhand" aided the students to understand the importance and prospects of coal and iron deposits within the states of Jharkhand and Odisha. The students gained an understanding of the rock types, structure and geological setup of these regions which is an invaluable tool to understand the overall evolution of the Indian Shield.
