




Educational Tour to Arunachal Pradesh


The educational tour conducted from 5–11 November gave us a valuable chance to learn directly from the landscapes of the Eastern Himalayas, particularly the districts of *West Kameng and Tawang* in Arunachal Pradesh. Travelling from Ranchi to Guwahati and then gradually moving into the steep, high-altitude terrain allowed us to observe how the environment changes with height—from the plains to the rugged mountains. This journey helped us understand altitudinal variations, landforms, and ecological transitions that are typical of this part of the Himalayas.

During our visits to Bomdila, Dirang, Sela Pass, Tawang, and Bumla Pass, we came across several important physical features such as deep V-shaped valleys, glacial passes, river systems and slopes shaped by natural processes. These sites clearly showed the influence of climate and tectonic activity on the region. We also observed differences in temperature, soil types, and vegetation as we moved upward—from dense temperate forests at lower elevations to sparse alpine vegetation near the passes.

The settlements we passed highlighted how people adapt their lifestyle, architecture, and culture to the challenges of mountainous terrain and harsh climatic conditions. Our fieldwork further revealed the rich ecological diversity of the region. In areas like Dirang and West Kameng, we studied how vegetation, soil, and microclimate vary with altitude. The pattern of settlements—often located on safer slopes and near water sources—helped us understand how the environment influences where and how people live. Traditional Monpa houses, built with stone and wood, showed clear adaptations to cold weather, earthquakes, and limited agricultural land. A major cultural highlight was our visit to the Tawang Monastery, one of the largest monasteries in Asia. Exploring the monastery helped us appreciate how religion, tradition, and the environment come together to shape community life in this remote high-altitude region. Overall, the tour was a rich academic experience. It helped us connect classroom concepts with real geographical observations and gave us a deeper understanding of the physical environment, cultural landscape, and environmental challenges of the Himalayas. The tour added a practical dimension to our studies and made the learning experience truly memorable.

The discussions emphasized critical and strategic minerals, geological training and internships, and the role of educational institutions in supporting sustainable resource development

Participation in FJCCI Meeting

This report presents the details of Ms. Mable M. Toppo's participation and contribution in a meeting organized by the Federation of Jharkhand Chamber of Commerce and Industries (FJCCI). The meeting was convened to discuss key policy concerns related to environmental sustainability, industrial practices, and resource management within Jharkhand.

The discussions primarily centered on the use and regulation of plastic, depletion and contamination of water resources, and sustainable water usage in mining operations.



Tier-II Training on Ground Water Related Issues & Management

The Department of Geology, St. Xavier's College, Ranchi, in collaboration with the Central Ground Water Board (CGWB), State Unit Office, Ranchi, successfully conducted a three-day Tier-II Training Program on Ground Water Related Issues & Management from 14 to 16 October 2025.

The program was organized as part of CGWB's national capacity-building initiative to enhance technical awareness among students, researchers, and academic stakeholders about groundwater resource evaluation, exploration, management, and conservation strategies.

The training program brought together experts from the CGWB including Scientists-B and Scientists-C, field hydrogeologists, drilling specialists, and regional directors who delivered lectures and hands-on sessions in hydrogeology, groundwater exploration, drilling technology, aquifer characteristics, and water-resource management.
