Report on International Women's Day 2025 Celebrations

Title of the Event: International Women's Day

Overview:

St. Xavier's College, Ranchi commemorated International Women's Day 2025 with a vibrant and diverse range of activities aligned with the global IWD 2025 theme "Accelerate Action." The events aimed to promote awareness on women's issues and gender equality, celebrate women's creativity and inspire empowerment through education, art, and dialogue.

Objective:

The International Women's Day 2025 celebrations at St. Xavier's College, Ranchi, aimed to foster awareness, dialogue, and action around gender equality, women's empowerment, and social responsibility. Through a series of thoughtfully curated events—including Nukkad Nataks, a photography competition, an arts and craft exhibition cum sale, a cosplay event, a "Best Out of Waste" competition, and an expertled talk session on human rights—the Women's Cell sought to engage students creatively, intellectually, and emotionally. The overarching goal was to empower students to reflect on women's issues, celebrate their achievements, and envision a more equitable and inclusive society.

Outcome:

The celebration succeeded in engaging students across disciplines and academic levels through a diverse array of events, each highlighting a unique aspect of women's experiences and aspirations. The Nukkad Nataks provoked critical thought on gender bias and violence; the photography competition encouraged students to capture and celebrate the dynamism of women in everyday life; the arts and craft exhibition nurtured creativity and entrepreneurship; the cosplay event promoted cultural awareness and celebrated female agency through powerful character portrayals; the Best Out of Waste competition instilled sustainable thinking and hands-on innovation; and the human rights talk session deepened the students' understanding of systemic challenges and actionable change.

Collectively, these events not only showcased student talent and awareness but also built a campus environment that values dialogue, inclusivity, and gender justice. The overwhelming student participation, faculty engagement, and interactive nature of the programmes ensured that the message of this year's theme—"Accelerate Action"—was meaningfully communicated and internalised.

As part of the International Women's Day celebrations at St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Ranchi, a Cosplay Competition was held on March 8,

2025, commencing at 12:45 p.m. The event was based on the theme "Female-Centric Approach" and sought to highlight iconic female figures embodying strength, resilience, and leadership.

The competition was organised and coordinated under the able guidance of Prof. Shilpa Kindo, Prof. Shalini Minz, Dr. Neel Kusum Kullu, Prof. Aroma, and Prof. Sneha Kindo. A total of ten participants from various departments presented thought-provoking and impactful performances.

In an era marked by overconsumption and the growing threat of environmental degradation, inculcating sustainable habits among younger generations has become imperative. Recognising the need to foster awareness and responsibility towards waste management, the Women's Cell of St. Xavier's College, Ranchi, organised a "Best Out of Waste" Competition, aimed at encouraging creativity through recycling and upcycling.

The objective of the event was to inspire students to create innovative and functional products for home interiors and exteriors using discarded or recyclable materials. The key evaluation criteria included optimal use of materials, execution of ideas, aesthetic appeal (colour combinations), and usability of the final product.

The event was coordinated by Prof. Manisha Tirkey, Prof. CMA Ekta Arya, Prof. Sandhya Bhengra, Prof. Sumita Hazra, and Prof. Kavita Topno. A total of 17 groups, each comprising two students, enthusiastically participated in the on-the-spot competition. The participants were given a time limit of two hours to conceptualise and create their entries.

The first prize was awarded to Amisha Kumari and Supriya Kumari from the Department of Botany for their creatively designed planter. The second prize was secured by Sanjana Kumari and Ashma Hembrom from the Department of Education for their innovative bird feeder. The third prize went to Jaya Kumari and Bhavya Kumari from the Department of Sociology for their aesthetically pleasing decorative figurine.

The judging panel for the event included Prof. Swagata Chakraborty, Prof. Sudha R. Khalkho, and Prof. Shubham, who commended the participants for their ingenuity, teamwork, and environmental sensitivity.


Events like these serve as a powerful reminder that with creativity and awareness, waste can be transformed into something both meaningful and beautiful.

• Detailed Report:

To mark International Women's Day, the Women's Cell in collaboration with the Department of Political Science, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Ranchi, organised a thought-provoking talk session aimed at sensitising students to the myriad challenges faced by women in contemporary society, while also exploring the available legal, social, and institutional remedies.

Following the inaugural programme, the session was graced by a distinguished panel comprising Ms. Sandhya Singh Kuntia, Vice President of the Women's Wing, Tribal Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (Jharkhand), an accomplished entrepreneur and certified leadership trainer; Mr. Mohit Mohan Samad, a noted motivational and entrepreneurial speaker; and Mr. Anurag Patrick Minz, State President, Human Rights Commission.

Drawing on their extensive experience in the fields of human rights and women's empowerment, the speakers addressed deep-rooted socio-cultural issues that continue to afflict women even in the digital age. They raised pertinent and thought-provoking questions such as, "How many girls are truly included in the decision-making processes within their families?" and "Are their voices genuinely heard and respected?" The panel underscored the significance of financial independence as a cornerstone of women's empowerment and societal progress. Issues of women's safety were also addressed, with emphasis placed on the importance of self-defence training as a means of fostering both confidence and security.

The event was meticulously coordinated by Dr. Saumya M. Sinha, Dr. Shreya Pandey, and Prof. Sneha Violet Kindo of the Department of Political Science.

The session left a profound impact on the audience, inspiring reflection and dialogue. It is expected to contribute meaningfully towards building a more equitable and inclusive society—one in which women are not only nurturers but also empowered individuals, free to soar beyond the confines of domestic limitations and rise, like the phoenix, into their full potential.

Detailed Report:

Team Abhivyakti, comprising undergraduate students of different departments, presented a ten minute- long Nukkad Natak titled 'Mehfooz Hain' to raise questions on lack of equality, opportunities, and security as faced by women in the male- dominated society. The play interrogated family, community, polity, and judiciary alike in the unending maltreatment of women. Participants pointed out the unfortunate prevalence of issues like domestic violence, rape culture, cyber bullying, commodification of women, and socio- political apathy and judicial inadequacy to penalize the perpetrators. In a thought- provoking critique, the play also underlined the dangers of extrajudicial policing and mob trial in the wake of systemic failure to ensure gender justice. Factual accuracy, coupled with apt theatrics, conveyed the sheer urgency of the situation to the viewers.

Harshita Kumari, Dept. of Botany, secured the second rank with her clicks of village women gracefully acing the challenges of daily life. Ankita Prerna Topno, Dept. of Botany, came third with her pictures of women weaving success stories through cottage industries.

The competition encouraged the use of photography to open one's eyes to the hidden gems and latent challenges concerning women around us.

As part of the International Women's Day 2025 celebrations, the Women's Cell of St. Xavier's College, Ranchi, organised an Arts and Craft


