PARTICIPATION & RESPONSE:


- · The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students across different departments. A significant number of entries were received, each carrying unique perspectives and creative expressions.

The competition was organized to provide a creative platform for students to express their thoughts through doodle art and poetry, encouraging innovation, imagination, and literary skills in an engaging manner.


EVENT DESCRIPTION:-

























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OUTCOME:-

CONCLUSION:-
























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KEY HIGHLIGHTS:-

Flow of the Event :-

- 09:15 a.m. Reporting of participants
- 09:30 a.m. Call of the event and opening session
- 10:00 a.m. 01:00 p.m. Round 1 (Discussion under Rule 193)
- 01:00 p.m. 02:00 p.m. Round 2 (Opposition questions on the ruling side's submissions)
- 02:00 p.m. 03:00 p.m. Round 3 (Ruling side questions on opposition's submissions)
- 03:00 p.m. 04:00 p.m. Round 4 (Open House session)
- 04:00 p.m. 05:00 p.m. Conclusion and award distribution

Structure of the Competition

Round 1 - Discussion under Rule 193

- -General discussion on the given topic.
- -Members from both ruling and opposition sides participated.
- -Each member was given 3-5 minutes to present views.
- -No interruptions allowed except with Speaker's permission.

Round 2 - Opposition Questions

- -The opposition questioned the ruling side's submissions from Round 1.
- -Time limit: 1 minute per question, 2 minutes per answer.
- -The speaker ensured relevance and avoided repetitive or irrelevant queries.

Round 3 - Ruling Side Questions


- -The ruling party posed questions to opposition members.
- -Same time limit as Round 2.
- -Fairness and order maintained under Speaker's supervision.

Round 4 - Open House

- -Informal session to encourage free dialogue.
- -Duration: 1 hour, with no marking.
- -Any member could raise points after seeking permission.
- -Maximum 2 minutes per speaker.







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Do's and Don'ts Followed by Participants

Do's:

- 1. Show respect to the Chair, Speaker, and members.
- 2. Speak only with the Speaker's permission.
- 3. Base arguments on facts, not assumptions.
- 4. Raise hands for permission to speak.
- 5. Use English, Hindi, or both.
- 6. Resume seats when the Speaker or any member holds the floor.

Don'ts:

- 1. No nuisance or disruption allowed.
- 2. No targeting of political parties, castes, religions, or individuals.
- 3. No controversial remarks or personal attacks.
- 4. No use of written speeches (notes allowed only for reference).
- 5. No recording of proceedings (audio or video).
- 6. No misconduct or use of mobile phones.

OUTCOME OF THE EVENT:-

The Empyrean Club's Youth Parliament was a well-structured, intellectually stimulating, and democratic exercise. The Youth Parliament created an engaging and disciplined environment where students debated the highly relevant and sensitive issue of data privacy vs. national security. Participants showcased strong research, logical reasoning, and debating skills.


